Good day, homeowners and renters!

As we move through what has been a long and challenging winter, I want to take a moment to acknowledge the patience and resilience of everyone in our community at Sunshine Country Club Estates.

### **A Winter of Disruption — and Progress**

This season has not been an easy one. Between the installation work for fiber internet and the important roof project at Retzlaff Hall, there has been noticeable disruption to our daily routines. Equipment, crews, noise, and shifting schedules have all tested our flexibility. However, these projects are necessary improvements that will serve our community for years to come.

The fiber internet installation represents an investment in modern infrastructure. Reliable, high-speed connectivity is no longer a luxury — it is essential for work, communication, entertainment, and property value. While the process has been inconvenient, the long-term benefit will be significant for both homeowners and renters.

The roof replacement at Retzlaff Hall has been even longer in the making. Addressing it now protects one of our most important community assets and prevents more costly repairs in the future. Though it has taken time and required patience, we are finally taking care of what needed to be done.

She is a new resident and is already on the volunteer trail. **And many thanks to those who are retiring from the 2025 Board: Randy Davis and Scott Kronshage**. You served our community well. I know from personal experience being on the SEPO Board is not an easy 'volunteer' job, but it can be extremely rewarding.

I want to thank the many resident volunteers who assisted me on the 2026 SEPO Election Committee. That work could not have been accomplished without you. We did come away with lessons learned again this year, which I will be working with the 2027 Election Committee chairperson to incorporate into the Election Committee Process Guide. That's right, three years is enough for me as chairperson, although I've enjoyed it and have learned lots.

And finally, here are three 'facts' resulting from the 2026 election:

1. There were three open Board positions and three owners who volunteered to run. Guess what, they all had at least one vote, so they were all elected to your 2026 SEPO Board. Congratulations again. (See the names above.)
2. We had one proposed Covenants change this year.

It was a super important vote. Hence, the campaign by lots of folks to get it 'approved'. However, as you can see from the chart on the following page, it did not get approved. I am not positive, but I'm thinking you might see this ballot proposal again in the future.






