

SEPO Board

Happy New Year. I hope everyone is/has been enjoying the holidays. To those of you who have been travelling, welcome back. And to those who are still away, have a safe journey back.

Mark Owen has been appointed and he has accepted the position of Board Treasurer filling the spot left vacant when Mecca Henry resigned. He will maintain this position until the end of Mecca's term, which will be at the next Board election in Feb 2022.

The 2022 SEPO Board Nominating Committee has been hard at work finding candidates to run in the Feb 2022 Board election. There will be three positions to fill – Mark Owen, Lyn Swonger and Tony Tramel. The committee will announce the names of the nominees on Dec 27, 2021.

As we head into the new year, the Board continues to work on multiple items. At the top of the list is our effort concerning **possible changes to our SEPO Covenants and Bylaws**. The proposed documents have been distributed to the entire Board and we plan to meet in early January to review. We are hoping to finish our review in anticipation of residents voting on the changes as part of the Annual Meeting election process on February 15, 2022. If we can get everything prepared for this vote, we anticipate holding several educational-type meetings so residents can ask questions and understand all of the issues prior to casting their votes. SEPO residents must understand, even if a vote is not called in 2022, or if a vote is called and items do not pass, some of the proposed changes are effective regardless, because they are TX Law, which overrides our governing rules.

We are also Utilizing Law Firm LADD & THIGPEN, P.C. to develop Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Leasing and Occupancy of Units.

In December we implemented several revisions to our SEPO Policies & Procedures, which include: two formal policies – one dealing with Men's and Women's Golf League play and the other dealing with 'no feeding of ducks on the golf course'. We also updated the Architectural Control Committee policy to conform with process updates made by that committee earlier in 2021.

We could use a few more volunteers for our various projects. A thorough, quality orientation is always available. This program is for all Sunshine residents so don't miss your opportunity to get involved – we are the "eyes and ears" of Sunshine.

Neighborhood Watch programs help keep neighborhoods and communities safe. Have you noticed the amount of crime in here? Well, it did not happen overnight. We have a well-established crime prevention program and you are the reason. The Bad Guys know not to mess with us. It did not happen overnight! You are responsible for this phenomenon. Together with the Harlingen and Combes PD we learn how to protect ourselves and our homes. We have a greater sense of security and it even improves our property's value. Don't mess with success. Let's continue the tradition. Crime prevention programs require organization and good communication with our neighbors. The Police work in partnership to teach us these skills.

You may wonder – Sunshine is a quiet little spot – is our NW just a waste of time and resources? Well, there are other benefits. A NW helps the community come together and we learn to work together for the health and well-being of a safe neighborhood. This kind of ownership is important – we form bonds of community and friendship for a common good.

So, the rest of the story..... It is very beneficial to have a NW here. It is not a difficult project. Crime Prevention – we do more than fight crime – we prevent it. We have 3 STOP-THE-BLEED bags. Are you aware that in less than ten minutes with severe bleeding you can bleed out?
