SEPO BOARD

March usually marks the beginning of the exodus to the north. I guess some of us miss the cold weather. We wish everyone a safe trip north and a great summer. Hope to see you all in the fall.

I would like to remind everyone of the following SEPO rules:

- Signs: one per lot on the street and golf course, no larger than 144 square inches. This applies to all signs.
- Setback: 10 ft from the street and 5 ft on the rear and sides. No structure, fence etc should be within the setback. I believe this is also city code.
- Landscaping/Dumping: This area in the Storage Lot is strictly for natural landscaping debris no wood products.
- The board will be looking at the following projects this summer:
 - Indiana Circle: patch or a major permanent repair
 - Pavilion: sound proofing will be investigated again
 - Pool: raise the deep section to 4 ½ or 5 ft, less water = less chemicals, less gas = lower expenses
 - North end of Missouri entrance to Encore property: cement slope, consider drainage and access to Resaca for NHW patrol access
 - Storage yard: Pave or concrete from gate to golf net

We could sure use some feedback on these projects. Thanks

Our next NW-CERT meeting is Monday 16 March 2020 3pm Retzlaff Hall Coffee's always on. Sunshine community is always invited. Please mark your calendars. This March issue addresses two topics – informational and the NW Vendor Program concern.

Thanks to the Sunshine Women's Club and you all for approving a payment for the McGruffmobile for new batteries and a new headlight which was recently installed.

The NW – CERT March meeting typically entertains a discussion from you about how to prepare your home for your trip back North. Great suggestions are always welcome – let's have some sharing of ideas.

Is your SEPO Emergency Contact form up to date? Does your home have adequate solar lighting and noisy alarms to scare away Bad Guys or are you keeping it dark and cozy for them? We will also have a fun and informative "area-fam" golf cart tour around SCCE pointing out items of interest such as the Lift Station on Montana & Missouri and - why the alarm sounds when it is not working and WHO you should call, - what a transformer looks like (working or

fried), - Utility poles and Meters that should be clear of foliage and other stuff etc, etc.. Please don't miss out!

April is our Disaster Preparedness meeting – covering your concerns and your input. How to Be Prepared vs become a Shelter of Last Resort from previous lessons learned.

Evening Patrols change hours for the summer. Please contact Linda Jones for your opportunity.

Our NW generator will need a summer volunteer to start it once a month – any takers? (Apr May Jun Jul Aug Sept and Oct). The McGruffmobile would like a buddy to check his batteries and etc. too. Any takers?

The Harlingen Fire Department will be starting a CERT class...... Free! Saturday April 21 & 28 8am til 5p Saturday 4 April 8a – 2p (mock drill and graduation) I have applications. Prepare for everyday emergencies. Protect you and your family and your neighborhood in an emergency situation. Classes on What is CERT, Fire Safety, Disaster Psychology, Light Search & Rescue, Disaster Medical Ops, Disaster intelligence to support First Responders and more.....

A Citizens Police Academy Class is also in the works. Applications available. Free! Penal Code SWAT Active Shooter K-9 Gangs Traffic safety Child Safety Seats Fingerprints Firearm Safety Use of Force Taser Court Documents A typical PD day Ride-Alongs etc.

The American Red Cross - is looking for volunteers from communities (like ours) to go with the Fire Department and CERT. -- Project: Home Fire Preparedness (Harlingen area) Statistics: Deaths from fatal fire in USA = 7 a day. Goal: to reduce fire deaths & injuries by 25% in next 5 years. FIRE is fast hot dark and deadly. BTW - How's your Smoke Alarm? Do you need a bed rattler? What about your CO2 alarm? ? Canaries 400 fatalities a year! Plan: Daylight Savings Time is Sunday 8 March – Are you ready? Check yours out.

NW concern:

Vendor Patrol Program etc. Please give the following security matters your attention. Recently we were confronted with a dilemma. The SEPO Board wants to disband (and essentially has) the NW Vendor Program. The new Board may wish to reconsider so your input is important. It was instituted in Dec 2011 after a rash of home invasions and criminal mischief. The VENDOR protocol was described in the November- December 2019 Sunshine newsletter.

This was brought to your attention a month or two ago and again at the February Informational Meeting, the NW meeting and at Women's Club. Game plan: Essentially the Vendor registers

with us and you, the resident via a simple process – helps to point out good vehicles from the treasure hunters. They are issued a VENDOR hanging tag or a NW Orange card for identification purposes. Included in this program is also the vehicle "Vendor" Tag and the long term "Guest" tag for our regulars who do lawns and other work here etc..

Your opinion is important. Please take time to register your input on the following issues to the Board. For your convenience, there is a Sunshine form for *Suggestions, Complaints and Ideas* which is in the Office to the right of Valerie's window. When completed return it to the Suggestion Box (looks like a mail box with a slit - painted a cream color).

The NW program is not fool-proof but it does take a bite out of crime by intimidating Bad Guys. Safety and security is not convenient – it takes an investment from you. Complacency is what the Bad Guys bank on. NW is also a great marketing tool for home resales. According to the Bureau of Criminal Justice, over 40% of homes these days have an active NW which has proven to have a positive impact.

1. Front Gate Code – decision to change it or not, when and how often etc. NW discussion = up in the air since November – no action taken to change it yet. Typically, it has been changed yearly or so to keep the Bad Guys on their toes.

2. Keypad entry lock to Card Room, Exercise Room Building, Office Building and Retzlaff Hall – NW concern that these codes are all the same and are out there to one and all. Express your opinion – good idea or change it to another code or not.

3. Vendor Patrols (checking for **orange card on vehicle dashboard** if vehicle is not clearly advertised (such as Lowe's, Home Depot, Air Conditioner Guy, Electrician, Rudy's Roofing etc.) Established December 2011 after rash of home invasions and criminal mischief. A protocol came out in the November- December 2019 Sunshine newsletter – now it is currently disbanded by a Board decision. Do you want to reinstate the Vendor Program or not?
