I can't believe it's time to say this again – Merry Christmas everyone. And to those of you who will be traveling over the holidays, enjoy yourselves and please stay safe.

As we head toward yearend, the Board continues to work on multiple items. At the top of our list is our effort utilizing Law Firm LADD & THIGPEN, P.C. concerning **possible changes to our SEPO Covenants and Bylaws**. We anticipate residents voting on these recommendations as part of the Annual Meeting election process on February 15, 2022. We also anticipate holding several educational-type meetings so residents can ask questions and understand all the issues prior to casting their votes.

Unfortunately, one of our Board members resigned in November. We are working to find a replacement to complete the term of Board Treasurer.

This year we have approved several revisions to our SEPO Policies & Procedures, which include: Improvements to our financial process/reporting, removing text that conflicts with our Covenants, implementing SEPO resident/renter identifier golf cart stickers, reestablishing golf cart trail fees and dedicating them to golf course improvements.

At our 1 PM December 14 Board meeting we propose to discuss a formal policy dealing with Men's and Women's Golf League play. You can provide your comments to the Board about this and other Agenda or non-Agenda items at the Residents' meeting the day before, which is December 13 at 1 PM.

The SEPO Board Nominating Committee was appointed at the Board meeting on November 9. As a reminder here are some reasons why you would want to consider running for the Board.

- 3. You will bring valuable skills to the table.



But in the meantime, as we get caught up in the hustle & bustle thinking of why we celebrate this special time, don't forget the Bad Guys have their holiday planned too and possibly at your expense.

Consumer education is one of the best ways to ensure that you all enjoy a happy and safe holiday.

At home – fires, electric shock, carbon monoxide poisoning and injuries lead the list. Holiday lights, octopus extension cords & plugs and space heaters – dry trees and hot lights – candles – all keep EMS and the Fire Department busy.

Crime doesn't take a holiday - Other areas of concern range from being away for the holidays to Porch Pirates, traveling, shopping, pick-pockets, carrying cash vs credit cards, holiday safety in the home and the beat goes on...... Always shop with a friend and take precautions with your purse and wallet.

While at the Mall - Park carefully and in a well-lit spot. When approaching your vehicle, have your keys handy – get in quickly and lock your doors. Don't leave your presents in plain sight – put them in your trunk. Remember - an unlocked car is an invitation.
