SUNSHINE COUNTRY CLUB ESTATES – VENDOR PROGRAM

Please be aware that we are again initiating the VENDOR Program.

Help-wanted (NW volunteers) for this project. Perhaps even a "block captain" for each street to assist. --- If you are a homeowner considering a project, please visit the "*Mr. Fix-It*" list – available in the Library and on the Sunshine website (https://www.sunshinecountryclub.com/mr-fixit). This a resident compiled list of dependable vendors.

--- My NW goal is two-fold: **1. to have a "hanging tag"** for the vehicles of our "usual" vendors (lawn guys, housekeepers, etc.). It will be visible on their vehicle - windshield mirror. I will issue these.

2. Vendors – Procedure:

You (homeowner) hire them. Workers (head guy) will then apply at the Office for an Orange Vendor ID. He/she will produce their Driver's License – Valerie will "xerox" it for our records. This cardboard "orange card" will remain in their windshield until the job is completed. The card will have their name, your address and expected date for job completion. When the job is completed, the orange card should be returned to you.

This way everyone is aware of valid workers on your property and not opportunistic Bad Guys, (like the one who stole \$51,000 from an unsuspecting retired resident a few years back).

Asking your neighbor to keep an eye out while away is a time-tested way to protect your stuff and increase your peace of mind.

But what if you expanded that same sense of commitment on your street or in our community??? Everyone would look out for their neighbors! Have you thought of joining our Neighborhood Watch? We have a time-tested program, a greater sense of security, community service, a great relationship with Police & Fire & EMS – what more could a senior community wish for?

It is estimated that about 40% of residential neighborhoods are covered by a crime watch program. We are Harlingen's premier Neighborhood Watch!

We have a comprehensive program – a great rapport with Police, Fire and EMS. They frequently attend our meetings and give info, advice and updates. We attend the annual National Night Out each August at Lon C Hill Park and visit with the other Harlingen NW groups. This type of ownership improves our quality of life and forms bonds of community and friendship. Be part of something that matters!

There are a multitude of NW jobs & projects – try it, you'll like it!. All of you are expected – "if you see something – say something"! Our SCCE Neighborhood Watch has been going strong since Hurricane Dolly visited in 2008 (as is the CERT Team). We are a lucky community to boast this and to have such interested and supportive neighbors to keep it alive. Thanks. And lots of thanks to our local Harlingen Police Department, our Combes PD, our Harlingen Fire Department for their guidance.

We look out for each other which builds a sense of community and helps deter crime proactively. We also hope to make residents feel safer. We all take on this extra responsibility for the protection and security of the community by being vigilant.

Anyway, back to NW – simply a group of residents who live in SCCE and look out for each other. Try it, you'll like it! We work with Harlingen PD and local Law Enforcement groups to help prevent crime. They also have a great Citizens Police Academy course several times a year. We also have CERT training with the Harlingen Fire Department, as they also have an interest in us and they teach the Community Emergency Response Training class. John Combs teaches a basic First Aid Class & Stop The Bleed class.

The NW meets the 3rd Monday of the month (3pm Retz Hall) with an emphasis on specific concerns in the community. Everyone is invited. Most of the time the Harlingen PD comes to visit and sometimes does Combes PD. Since October is Fire Prevention Month, our emphasis will focus on this program. This year's theme is Protecting Lives and Property thru Education & Preparedness. Hopefully we shall raise awareness about fire safety and promote fire prevention. This theme dates back to the Great Chicago fire of 1871 which resulted in widespread destruction and the loss of hundreds of lives. President Woodrow Wilson issued the first National Fire Prevention proclamation in 1920. Our local Engine Company will be out to discuss fire extinguishers and give a practical demonstration on their care and use.

Our local Fire Department presented a Fire Extinguisher class for us – from a pamphlet to a practical! They have a portable fire teaching tool complete with TV screen and extinguisher. The screen depicts a fire and the fire extinguisher allows you to try to extinguish the fire – and you are on a timer. This enables you to have a hand-held practical lesson on the fire extinguisher and why you P.A.S.S. – Pull Aim Squeeze and Sweep. We also visited our kitchen and reviewed the elaborate fire system over the stove and etc. By the way – is your fire extinguisher at the ready?

The City of Combes recently sponsored a National Night Out & Fall Fest venue with their Police Department in their Community Park. You were all cordially invited to the festivities. Chief Quill has several times depended on us to help-out for several of their programs. Great fellowship!

Friday the 5th of January 2024, we will hold our Finger Lickin' Chicken fundraiser for Neighborhood Watch. Everyone is invited. Tickets will be available soon (\$10.00) for FLC, side and dessert with beverage. Plans & specifics in planning stages. Stay tuned!
