Neighborhood Watch Patrols

Linda & Dick Jones - making our Patrol Calendar happen. Thanks to those of you who help her make it happen. We would appreciate any volunteers. You will be properly oriented, receive an orange vest and the keys to the McGruffmobile (one key for the lock and the other for the ignition is your Golf Cart key isn't similar.)

Jan & Feb 2024 are out but we have too many unfilled spots. (annual schedule = winter has 2 patrols 8:30pm ~ and ~10:30pm. April thru September has 1 patrol.

<u>HELP WANTED !!!!!</u> Many hands make light work. You will be fully oriented and most appreciated.

A suggestion was made to post the NW schedule in the monthly newsletter. I will ask Beth.

Front Gate issues and etc.

Flashing Red Rotating Light – this light is fully operational, It is for use in case of an emergency for the EMS to see us as opposed to hunting in Encore accidentally.

Ric H spoke with Tom (Board) about it.

My reply was "in the old days", we had a "Be A Buddy" system – for instance, I feel that John will need EMS to the hospital – I ask "my buddy" to sit with me as I figure the game plan for the medical team. If I decide I need to go - you "my Buddy" will go to the Front Gate – turn on the RED ROTATING LIGHT and it will alert the EMS as to which entrance to use.

Tom Perrier (SEPO Board) will help facilitate getting your car to have the entry code. Contact him if you need.

SECURITY items:

The NW was never in charge of "security items" such as TV monitors and Front Gate Cameras etc. We also did not pay for these items. Some of our older members (who do no longer reside in SCCE anymore, had expertise in that area (and that's going back a good few years). They simply made sure they were in working order. (example- Trail cameras in the trees etc) COVID came and oversight became "not up to speed". This is a Board responsibility but – if it is ok with them and you have expertise, give them a call. (My opinion is that most of this gear is outdated and possibly will be upgraded). Another area - there is an IR system in the Woodworkers Shop/Storage area and several cameras elsewhere.

Locking Up the Buildings:

This is a Board responsibility. However, the NW found doors open, a/c running and etc. recently. We do not live in a barn. If you sponsor an event or use the area – secure it.

Block Captains: - We have 9 streets – Depending on the number of homes - a Block Captain and Co-Captains - play a role in keeping an eye out and sharing information. How 'bout signing up?

1. CERT Team:

We update our Sunshine Readiness Plan each April for PD, FD, EMT and Comm Center. You do not have to be a CERT member to assist. In March, we generally prepare some hints on how to get your home ready when heading "up North". But April is reserved for Disaster Preparedness.

2. Vendor Program - reinstated

As a homeowner, we all share responsibility in supporting a *Vendor management* program. Our Board has reviewed our SEPO & NW strategic plan and we are all invited to participate to mitigate potential risks.

3. McGruffmobile: NW Golf Cart (Lenore)

We could use a volunteer or two to assist with this job.

(Manny is standby for major issues and a local Golf Cart dealer (Mario).

Duty: keep an eye on the Golfcart. (batteries, water – general routine – bring concerns to Lenore).

4. Golf Cart Hand-held rechargeable Batteries

Thanks to Tom Gossman who has done this forever. We could use a volunteer. This requires the 2 Maglite batteries to be charged weekly. We have the charger.

5. Cameras – a SEPO Board project – still under construction

6. Dog Watch - Bike Patrol - Sunshine Street Strutters

These are 3 important "undercover" volunteer tasks.

If you see something – say something! for your vigilance as always – your intel is a big help. - Any volunteers?

7. Surveillance: all of us are responsible. *If you see something – say something!!!*

First, you complete your *Personal Inventory List* then we can set up the engraving process & give you the Operation ID decal. Additional Personal Inventory Lists are available in the Library next to the NW display.

Misc:

Vial of L.I.F.E. decals - available. What about "Who's Your Buddy"? This is especially useful to have a friend or neighbor to call upon if an emergency arises.

RED Envelope - with <u>current</u> health history. Complete the health hx, place in red envelope.

If you have a DNR make sure it is in there too – same for special medical documents.
