Update on projects:

Shuffleboard court lighting: contractor estimate high, lights will be purchased and our employees will install at a much lower cost

Tennis court lighting: estimate of \$19,000 cost prohibitive, other avenues are being investigated **Storage yard paving (gate to driving net):** estimate of \$14,000 cost prohibitive, other avenues are being investigated

Golf course: cart paths have been competed on holes 5 & 7, many thanks to John Whitley who offered to pay for the concrete on hole 5

Central area buildings: combination locks have been installed on all 3 buildings; code is same as front gate minus the "#" sign, as front gate changes so will door locks

Pool & hot tub: we have a new vendor for chemicals and service, a significant savings has already been achieved on chemicals, all chemicals are natural and remove the oils in the pool from sun screens and our bodies, the pool water is clearer and the discolor on the walls is already dissolving.

Thanks to the Women's Club for purchasing new shuffleboard equipment. The old equipment was donated to the Habitat for Humanity resale store.

Suggestions are always welcome. And we are looking for projects for 2020.

Two items that appear to be an ongoing problem is the excess water from resident's sprinkler systems and feeding of the ducks. Unfortunately, the problem continues due to a few residents not cooperating.

The two missing microphones have been replaced. Microphones will be kept in the office and signed out to residents.

It's going to be a stressful winter with numerous contractors working. Trailers, trucks, cars walkers, bike riders, golf carts will be creating an obstacle course. Please be extremely careful while maneuvering the streets.

Report on recent Salvation Army bell ringing effort by Sunshine residents

The Salvation Army is synonymous with helping others. They are well known for helping the disadvantaged during emergencies and for their Christmas programs (Angel Tree) and bell ringing for needy families and their kids.

Sunshine has been blessed much over many years helping here in Harlingen with the Friday after Thanksgiving. A wonderful part of this is that <u>all the funds raised locally are used locally</u>. Bell ringing is a big part of raising the funds. We raised \$1,007.66 this year, more than any other year during the single day effort. The figures were broken down as Pharmacy door \$563.88 and \$433.78 on the grocery side. That is a lot of single dollar and small coin donations.

Woodworkers' Club Report

Activity at the Woodshop is finally picking up as the late snowbirds make their migration south. At the most recent meeting, the Woodworkers' Club elected new officers for 2020. A heartfelt thank you to Chuck McEvoy who served as the Woodshop Secretary for 4 years.

The membership was recently presented with a proposal to investigate the possible purchase of a miraculous table saw called SAWSTOP. If you google it, you will see that somehow the whole table saw shuts down in a flash if flesh or dampness touches the saw blade. A demonstration of the SAWSTOP was held on Tuesday, December 17, and over 30 woodworkers attended. All were amazed at the split-second response of the table saw that eliminates the hazard of being cut by the saw. At the January 10 meeting, the membership will consider purchasing a SAWSTOP from the treasury and having a fund-raising effort to purchase a second SAWSTOP. The technology is available to end the possibility of serious injuries on table saws, so the matter is worth addressing. We encourage woodworkers to attend the January 10 meeting at 1:00 p.m. at the Woodshop to vote on this matter.

It is our hope that SEPO residents will once again support the Woodworkers' Spaghetti Dinner scheduled for Tuesday, January 21. Cathy Chajec is again heading up the event and will need several 9x13 cakes, cooks, servers and a clean-up crew to provide a nice evening at Retzlaff Hall. Tickets will be on sale starting January 6 and can be purchased from members of the Woodworkers' Club.
