## Women's Club meeting minutes, October ,17th, 2025

Roll call taken.

Pam recognized past Women's Club board members.

Eileen Anderson said the opening prayer.

The mission statement was read by Lexa Bentley.

Officer reports:

Pam Lacey Vice President, spoke about the importance of our club, and that we are the heart of the community. We work, play and serve together. Our 2nd priority is making money. Last year we had 24 events. It has allowed us to buy beneficial things for our community. Besides Pam, all the board members have our doors open for anyone with questions or concerns.

Lisa Perrier, secretary read the previous meeting minutes. Motion made/ seconded to accept the minutes as read. Motion accepted.

Marlene Parker, treasurer was not in attendance. Pam Lacey, read a brief version of the report. October 24th, last season, beginning balance was \$28,557.20. March, 2025, the balance was \$30,420.18. In the 2024-2025 season, the Women's Club contributed \$9,068.00 to the community. The current balance is \$24,393.20. Motion made/seconded to accept the treasures report. Motion accepted.

Mary Hull, Activity Director thanked Jill Ventrello for her previous service as Activity Director.

Upcoming events:

Octoberfest-October 21st-Pam will address in upcoming events.

Halloween-Mary asked if anyone was interested in organizing a Halloween parade. The question was put to the club Halloween parade, or not? The club overwhelming said no. Patricia Lay spoke on the Halloween Karaoke. This is a non Women's Club event. The Halloween karaoke will be October 31st, at 6:00 p.m. Bring light snacks. Dance sing, and have fun.

Veterans Day-November 11th. Cindy Hulswit, chair, spoke on event. We will celebrate all the Veterans in our community. There will be a flag ceremony in the hall. Pam mentioned that in the past we have donated food to Sonshine ministries at Halloween. Cindy Hulswit said that this has now been moved to Thanksgiving with details to follow.

Pam expanded on the Octoberfest details. The doors will open and check in at the outdoor pavilion at 4:00. The beer garden will be set up there. The will be a hammershlagen game at the pavilion along with "share the wealth". After that, at 5:00 you'll come in after having checked in at the pavilion for food. Committee report:

Storage manager-Liz Dietrick was unable to attend. She asked Pam to have everyone read her article in the Women's Club newsletter regarding the storage. Also, please be cognizant of things you may see around the storage room, and the storage sheds by the back dog park. If you see something, say something. We want to be good neighbors.

Newsletter-Cyndi Skidmore was unable to attend. Beth Parrish spoke on her behalf. The newsletter articles are due right now. Please do not wait until the last minute.

Kitchen Supplies-Vicky Jones. Vicky reminded everyone if you need something for the kitchen or upcoming event, please write it on the dry erase board in the kitchen, and she will purchase these items. Also, when an event is done, make sure everything is wrapped up. i.e. don't leave cups or silverware loose in the cupboards or drawers. Make sure they are put into ziplock bags or wrapped in the original packaging to prevent pests. Also, when food is leftover after an event, please do not leave food in the refrigerator. Offer to sell to the community, or have committee members take home. She also mentioned, if there is a lot of food, Loaves and Fishes will gladly take. If there is another event upcoming, ask if they can use any additional products. i.e. mustard, ketchup etc. Also, do not drop and leave random items in the kitchen. This includes, plates, napkins, food, food storage containers etc. They will not be used. It was also mentioned that each chairpersons responsibilities to wash any linens used. She mentioned the beautiful pillowcases that Jan Baethke and the quilting club have made. Audrie Andreatos also made some lovely hats in the school colors for all the kids and the teachers this summer. Mary would also like to see small baskets put together for the teachers. Please put it together and bring on December 10th. Pencils, staplers. Anything that teacher may need. Personal things will work as well. She is also looking for volunteers to be Mr and Mrs Claus. On Wednesday November 12th, from 10:00 to noon, we will be filling the back packs the supplies. Bring the baskets you may have for the teachers too. Email to follow.
