They are tight coils of moist soil and seeds rolled up in recycled strips packaging materials. Snail roll seed starting keeps everything compact and organized, making it an ideal solution for tight spaces.

I've experimented with them, and they've revolutionized the way I start seeds. They conserve an incredible amount of space and money, and potting couldn't be easier. At last, a snail that's a positive addition to the garden!
